
FOOD INSECURITY WORSENING

Six months after the outbreak of conflict, the crisis in South Sudan shows no sign of abating. The rainv season has set in, worsening living conditions and increasing disease. Close to 1.5 million people have been uprooted from their homes, and sporadic fighting continues. The revised Crisis Response Plan for 2014 calls for \$1.8 billion to assist 3.8 million people by December.
