

Six months after the outbreak of conflict, the crisis in South Sudan shows no sign of abating. The rainy season has set in, worsening living conditions and increasing disease. Close to 1.5 million people have been uprooted from their homes, and sporadic fighting continues. The revised Crisis Response Plan for 2014 calls for \$1.8 billion to assist 3.8 million people by December.

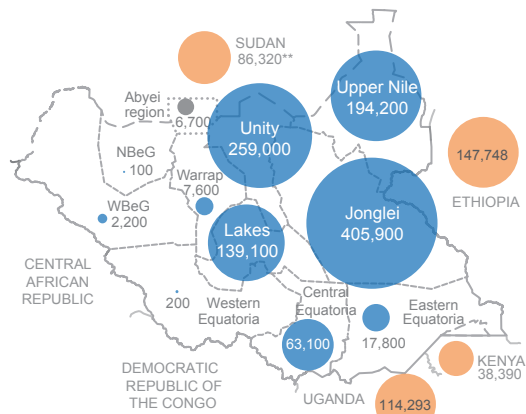

The violence and displacement has worsened an already fragile food security situation. It is estimated that 3.9 million people will face alarming levels of food insecurity by the end of August, the most affected being internally displaced people and host communities affected by the ongoing conflict. Up to 7.3 million will be at some risk of food insecurity over the course of the year.
